- ♦ If there's still some snow outside, like the snowdrift in the photo above, you can measure how deep it is using a yardstick. Feel the ground around the edges – where does it still feel wet? Where does it feel dry? Any green leaves or insects? Use a measuring cup and scoop up one cup of packed snow. Take the cup inside and predict how much liquid water will melt.
- ◆ Research cloud types and make a <u>cloud chart</u>, mobile, or some other form of cloud 'art.' Start simple with these cloud types: cirrus, cumulus, stratus, nimbus, cumulonimbus, and lenticular.
- ♦ Make a simple <u>wind vane</u> and include wind direction on your weather watch calendar. What direction does the wind mostly <u>come from</u> in your area?
